Objective

No formal education.

Accomplishments

Brought recognition to the importance of music in the Church.

World Events in the 100s A.D.

Hadrian rules over Rome

Parchment scrolls began to replace notebooks in Rome

Rome experiences a deadly plague

Death

Struck three times by a sword on her neck, she lived three days, dying three days later.

Patron Saint...

Patron Saint of music.

Usually pictured with an organ or a violin.

Remembrance

Her feast day is on November 22nd.

Many composers have written music in her honor. For example: Henry Purcell's Ode to St. Cecilia, or George Frederic Handel's Ode for St. Cecilia's Day, and Benjamin Britten's Hymn to St. Cecilia.
